



Dr. Charles Mathers serves as Associate Program Director of the UTMB/NASA-JSC Aerospace Medicine Residency and Medical Director for the Aerospace Medicine Center. He received his B.A. from Rice University and his M.D. and M.P.H. from The University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB). He is board certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American Board of Preventive Medicine in Aerospace Medicine. Ward Memorial Award for outstanding achievement during residency training in aerospace medicine.
